Classroom Changes

MUSA Little Lambs believes that it is important for children to enter kindergarten with a strong foundational knowledge of letters, numbers, colors, and seasons and holidays. MUSA Little Lambs has made several classroom changes to ensure that all of our youth will be prepared for kindergarten. The Little Lambs' schedule now includes more time for reading aloud, which is proven to be an effective method for preparing children to read on their own. In addition, MUSA Little Lambs' circle time has been revamped to include 'exploratory' components, leading participants on an in-depth exploration of classroom materials as they relate to the letter of the week. MUSA's preschoolers have also been spending an increased amount of time working on writing their names and learning about numbers. Over the past month, the Little Lambs have also closely examined the Thanksgiving holiday and have learned about the Pilgrims, Native Americans, and concepts such as 'generosity.'

Parent Resource Corner

MUSA Little Lambs works daily to foster a love of reading in your children. MUSA parents are encouraged to continue these reading practices at home. Studies show that reading regularly at home not only improves a child's reading ability, but it improves math skills as well!

Try to set a winter at-home reading goal for your child. Have fun helping them to design a chart that lists how many books they want to read with you at home each week. Have your child cross off the goals on the chart as they accomplish them, allowing them to see their progress. When they accomplish a goal, say...reading three books at home...allow them to choose a prize. Prizes can be as small as a sticker or letting them watch an extra 20 minutes of their favorite TV show.
